A recent study in *Pediatrics* reinforces how important it is to be aware of what your child watches—not only how much. Researchers divided 3- to 5-year-olds into two groups: one swapped shows that depict any violence with programs that highlight empathy and cooperative problem solving, such as *Sesame Street*. The other group had no restrictions on what they could watch. At the end of six months, and again at one year, the children in the first group were less aggressive and argumentative, and more cooperative than the other kids. The study authors suggest watching T.V. and movies with your child so you'll be tuned in to the specific content and can change the channel if necessary.
